Coordinated Demand Control Service
Code: E16

Availability

This Schedule is available for nonresidential electric service when facilities are installed to coordinate reduction of power requirements during Utility Peak periods. The customer must execute an Electric Service Agreement with the City prior to receiving service.

This Schedule is not available for resale service, or for short term or temporary service.

This Schedule supersedes the LGSCDC Rate Schedule adopted on December 1, 1994.

Applicability

This schedule is applicable to all electric service supplied to Customer's premises at one point of delivery.

Type of Service

The type of service to which this Schedule is applicable is three-phase alternating current, 60 hertz, at one of the City's standard voltages of 480 volts or higher. When the transformer capacity installed to provide service is in excess of 2,500 kVA, service will be provided at 12,470 volts or higher. If the customer requests a lower voltage, additional costs incurred by the City will be recovered through separate Facilities Charge. (See Special Facilities)

Contract Demand

The Contract Demand shall be the kilowatts of demand specified in the Service Agreement.

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Billing Demand

The *Utility Peak Contribution* shall be the average kilowatt demand measured in the 60-minute interval which is used by the North Carolina Eastern Municipal Power Agency for wholesale billing purposes during the calendar month of power use.

Excess Demand shall be the Customer's maximum 15-minute demand during the billing month less the Utility Peak Contribution. However, Excess Demand shall not be less than 80% of the Contract Demand or 80% of the customer's maximum 15-minute demand during the eleven previous billing months, whichever is greater, less the Utility Peak Contribution for the current billing month.

Notification by the City

The City will use diligent efforts to predict Utility Peak each month and notify customer in advance. However, the City is not able to guarantee an accurate prediction and notice will be provided. Notification by the City will be provided to customer by direct telephone communications or automatic signal, as mutually agreed. Customer will hold the City harmless in connection with its response to notification.

Power Factor Adjustment

When the power factor in the current billing month is less than 90%, the monthly bill will be increased by a sum equal to \$0.42 multiplied by the difference between the maximum reactive kilovolt amperes (kVAR) registered by a demand meter suitable for measuring the demands used during a 60-minute interval and 48% of the maximum kW demand registered in the current billing month.

Special Facilities

The City will furnish and install facilities not normally required for service under this Rate Schedule upon reimbursement by the customer or agreement for the customer to pay a Facilities Charge of 2.0% per month of the installed cost.

Sales Tax

North Carolina Sales Tax will be added to the above charge, if applicable.

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Payments

Bills are due when rendered and are payable within 15 days from the date of the bill. If any bill is not so paid, the City has the right to suspend service in accordance with its Service Regulations. In addition, any bill not paid on or before the expiration of 15 days from the date of the bill is subject to an additional charge of 1½ % per month of the balance in arrears.

General

Service rendered under this schedule is subject to the City's Service Regulations and Code of Ordinances as amended from time to time, and normal operating practices.

Effective Date

Effective for billing rendered on or after February 1, 2006.
